THE CHALLENGES OF FARMING

How can two years be so different? The spring of 2024 was so wet, it was impossible to start planting to achieve the usual growing season. This year everything got planted on time, but keeping the plants alive has been quite a challenge. Worryingly we are not alone, as this has been the case across most of the country. Irrigation out in the fields of Clinks Farm started in March and continues on a daily basis. It's meant root vegetables like new Potatoes and carrots cropped late and were initially quite small. With so much time spent moving and setting up of the irrigation, weeds have thrived. Pest control has also been a big issue on our vegetables, with an explosion of sap sucking insects like Aphids and Flea Beetles. We also have issues with our grass which we cut for Hay, as it's all very short and already going to seed. Pictures below showing Jake moving irrigation, Potato harvesting, weeds competing with the Onions and grass having gone to seed in June.









NEW ARRIVALS ON THE FARM

Spring always brings an additional influx of new born animals on the farm and this year has been no exception. During the lambing period 25 sheep were born, which always creates a raised level of excitement to our farm helpers, volunteers and staff alike. Our Goats produced 14 kids over the last few weeks, giving everyone a chance of a cuddle. The Pigs which are not quite so cuddly, but a favourite to many, produced 11 piglets in the same period.

OUR REGULAR SUNDAY WILDLIFE AND UNUSUAL PLANT SPOTTING

Hi my name is Baz and I attend Clinks Care Farm twice a week. I have always been an avid bird lover & watcher because I love being outdoors & seeing loads of different species. I visit nature reserves at Minsmere, Strumpshaw Fen, Abberton, Ransworth, Cley Marshes, Benarce, & Hickling Broads. I am teaching my friends at the farm to indentify local bird species. I like being at Clinks farm working with the goats and working with my friends. Some of the wildlife we spotted on Sunday 15th June 2025 were Common Buzzard, Western Barn Owl, Red Kite, Water Deer, European Robin and a Kestrel. Plants included Pyramiday Orchid and Bee Orchid. A member of Norfolk Wildlife Trust and I saw 2 Grey Partridges. Previously we have seen a Twite. This unusual bird on the fam was sitting on the base of the tree; it is one of the finch family. JOBBING AROUND AND ABOUT

Moving and repairing fences is ongoing, usually to relocate animals once they have stripped their current feeding ground. Cleaning polytunnels up to 12 feet high is no easy task, but they all have to be done to allow grime and Algae to be removed to maximise light penetration. After rebuilding the shop entrance porch, we have moved the old wooden structure to the pick your own flower garden. It needed some re-planking and a good coat of paint. We had a major failure in our egg sorting station. The old floor had to be removed and a new, but much thicker plywood floor was installed.
